

Draw

• A priority number will be assigned to each applicant for each individual application.

1) Batch 1: applicants who opted in:

- IDNs have the priority.
- Non-IDNs will be next.

2) Batch 2: applicants who opted out:

- IDNs have the priority.
- Non IDNs will be next.

Priority number will determine the order in which the applications will be evaluated at each stage.



Step 1: Objection

- Objection period is scheduled to end March 13th 2013.
- Applications free of objections and contention will proceed to the next step.
- Applications which fail the Initial Evaluation phase are required to clear an extended evaluation first. Following that, they can proceed to clear/respond to the objections received.
- If an application can pass the extended evaluation, and/or reconcile the received objection, they will proceed to the next stage in the same week as the applications that were free from objections and/or contentions.



Step 2: Accepting Standard agreement

• Applications that pass step 1 have two options:

1) to accept the posted standard agreement and move to the next phase

OR

2) to elect and enter into a contract negotiation with ICANN

- Applicants will enter a negotiation queue and be processed based on 'draw number.'
- Multiple negotiations will occur simultaneously.
- Once the negotiation is completed, the application will be processed the same week as the applications that opted to agree to the standard contract.

> Please note: the contract will not be executed at this stage.



Step 3: predelegation testing

- Applicants that successfully proceed from the contract negotiation/ acceptance are then required to make an appointment for predelegation testing.
- There will be 20 slots per week.
- Missed appointments, or testing failure, will be rescheduled and allocated to an available slot for testing at a later date.



Step 4: Contract signing

- For those applicants that emerge from step 3 and accept ICANNs agreement, ICANN will proceed in executing the agreement.
- Contracts will begin execution following the ICANN 46: Beijing meeting (11th April).




IANA Delegation

- IANA will process on a first-come first-served basis.
- IANA will delegate the new gTLDs at a rate of 80 gtlds per month.
- Target is 1000 gTLDs per year.
